**Description Kremenets. Jesuit Collegium** 

This is an architectural monument of the XVIII century in the late Baroque style. In the center there is magnificent church with rich architectural décor. Its height reaches 42 meters. Two-story buildings are adjacent to the church from three sides. The Collegium is the tallest building in Kremenets – a cozy Volyn city surrounded by the beauty of picturesque mountains, and a castle that rises above the city.

The collegium trained teachers for Jesuit schools. However, in 1773, Pope Clement XIV abolished the Jesuit Order, and the Collegium was closed. Later, a secular school began to operate here. When, according to the 3rd partition of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth (1795), Kremenets reverted to the Russian Empire, in 1805 the Higher Volyn Gymnasium was opened here, which in 1819 was reorganized into the Volyn Lyceum (valid until 1833). The Lyceum had a large library (more than 50,000 volumes). Teaching here was at such a high level that the institution was equated with the University of Vienna. The buildings of the Collegium are still used for educational purposes – now there is a Humanitarian and Pedagogical Institute named after Taras Shevchenko.
